It's Official! - Our STP is Making 'Advanced' Progress

Progress in delivering the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough STP has been assessed as 'advanced' by NHS England and NHS Improvement. The assessment, published on 21st July, took account of health and care service performance and patient-focused change across the county in areas such as emergency care, cancer care and prevention.

The STP Progress Assessment provides headline ratings for STPs in four bandings:

1 - Outstanding; 2 - Advanced; 3 - Making Progress; 4 - Needs Most Improvement.

Tracy Dowling, Accountable Officer for the STP said: "We are pleased that the progress being made across the County is recognised in this assessment. All of us working in health and care are focussed on supporting local people to live healthy lives and on ensuring that those who need to use health and care services can do so quickly and effectively.

"However, the STP is a 5-year programme and we're only a short way into the journey of ensuring that the people of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough have a health and care system that is driven by quality and is sustainable."

Dr Alex Gimson, Chair of the Care Advisory Group (CAG) said: "Improving and sustaining the quality of services is of paramount importance to us. The service quality factors used in the assessment highlight where we're doing well, such as in ensuring people aren't waiting longer than they should be for treatment and recovery rates for people who access psychological therapies.

"A key priority for improvement is the amount of time people wait in Accident & Emergency and, although progress is being made and performance is improving, this is a major focus for our STP delivery this year. We have invested in expanding and improving community based services in order to identify and care for more vulnerable people in their homes rather than risk people ending up unnecessarily in Accident & Emergency and then being admitted to hospital."

Accountable Officer (AO)

Tracy Dowling, who is the current STP AO, will continue in the role for the medium term. Having recently left Cambridgeshire & Peterborough CCG, Tracy is due to take up the role of Chief Executive at Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Foundation Trust (CPFT) later this month and the CPFT Board has agreed to her continuing as STP AO for two days a week.

Executive Programme Director

The role of full-time Executive Programme Director was recently advertised and Catherine Pollard has been appointed. Many colleagues will know Catherine from her work in the system during 2016, when she had a leading role in developing our STP whilst on assignment from NHS Improvement. We expect Catherine to join us in the Autumn and she will be responsible for leading the work of the System Delivery Unit (SDU).

Scott Haldane will continue to cover the Executive Programme Director role in an interim capacity and will then revert, full-time, to his substantive role as Director of Finance at CPFT, once Catherine commences.
