


- **Introduction to Safeguarding Adults Level 1**
30 minutes
Introduction to Safeguarding Adults Level 1 Assessment – 12 questions
(Estimate 5 minutes to complete)
- **Safeguarding Adults Level 2 (includes Prevent Basic Awareness, MCA & DoLs)**
30 minutes
Safeguarding Adults Level 2 Assessment – 10 questions
(Estimate 5 minutes to complete)

The member of staff will need to keep a record of completion. As a certificate is not generated for this online training it is suggested that once completed, a 'screen shot' be taken of the results page (appendix 2) and saved as a Word document. The Word document can be sent to HR along with the notification of completion form.

Press the 'PrtSCN' button (or similar) (appendix1), often found at the top or right side of the keyboard. This action enables you to take a picture of the screen showing the result of your assessment. The screen also shows the date and time the assessment was completed.

Open a blank Word document, and using your right mouse button click on 'paste', which will put the picture of your screen into the Word document.

Type your name, Job title, and the date the assessment was completed below it., then save your document.

MCA and DoLS Training

The Cambridgeshire & Peterborough CCG and LGSS - Mental Capacity Act and Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards Training Offer

All of these FREE courses are tailored to the needs of all staff who work in clinical settings and will support all staff to meet their regulatory and professional responsibilities.

All the sessions are delivered at your service and you can always partner with other Primary Health services if you wish. The length of the course can be tailored to your needs but we would always require over an hour for the sessions to be delivered.

- **An Introduction to the Mental Capacity Act and Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards for Health Professionals**

This course provides information and guidance and serves as a useful introduction for all staff both clinical and administrative who work in GP Practices specifically, but the session can be tailored to the needs of professionals in any clinical setting.

Course Duration: 1 to 2 hours

Delivered: In-house

- **Supported Decision-Making, the Mental Capacity Act and Deprivation of Liberty in Clinical Practice – An Advanced Course**

The aim of this course is to provide a practical and skills-based approach to capacity assessments, best interests decisions and how to use the legislation when working in clinical practice. This course is intended for health professionals who have knowledge of the MCA, i.e. have previously attended a training course and who would like to develop and enhance their knowledge in the practical application of MCA.

FREE online MCA / DoLS e-learning

Health professionals can also access FREE online learning that is accredited by the RCGP's, but we highly recommend that this is used to supplement but not replace face-to-face training.

The Mental Capacity Act was introduced in 2005 and a House of Lords Select Committee was set up to conduct post-legislative scrutiny of the MCA, in order to find out if the Act was working as Parliament intended. The report was published in March 2014.

The committee found that there was a general lack of awareness of the provisions of the Act, which has allowed prevailing professional practices to continue unchallenged, and allowed decision-making to be dominated by professionals, without the required input from families and carers about the patient's wishes and feelings.

As the select committee report found - there is a general lack of understanding in the medical profession around the Mental Capacity Act, this poses a risk to those professionals delivering care and their patients. Medical Protection has worked in partnership with Cambridge County Council to produce this 9 Module course to help healthcare professionals understand:

- What the MCA is?
- What they need to know?
- How it affects them?
- How it affects their patients?
- How to apply this to their practice?

That will take you to the homepage, scroll down to the blue box and click on 'register'.

When you have entered your registration details and pressed 'create my account' an activation email will be sent to the email address you have supplied. It may take a while to come through so please be patient (if it fails to arrive contact the e-learning email address on the website)

When you click on the activation link in the email you receive, it will open up the webpage, logged into your account with 'no course information to show'. Click on the orange button 'Find courses', Choose 'Mediological issues [Medical]' and the course will appear beneath called Mental Capacity Act and Deprivation of Liberties. Click 'Add to learning'

The training will be shown in modules ready to go. Click on the 'play' icons to activate each module.
