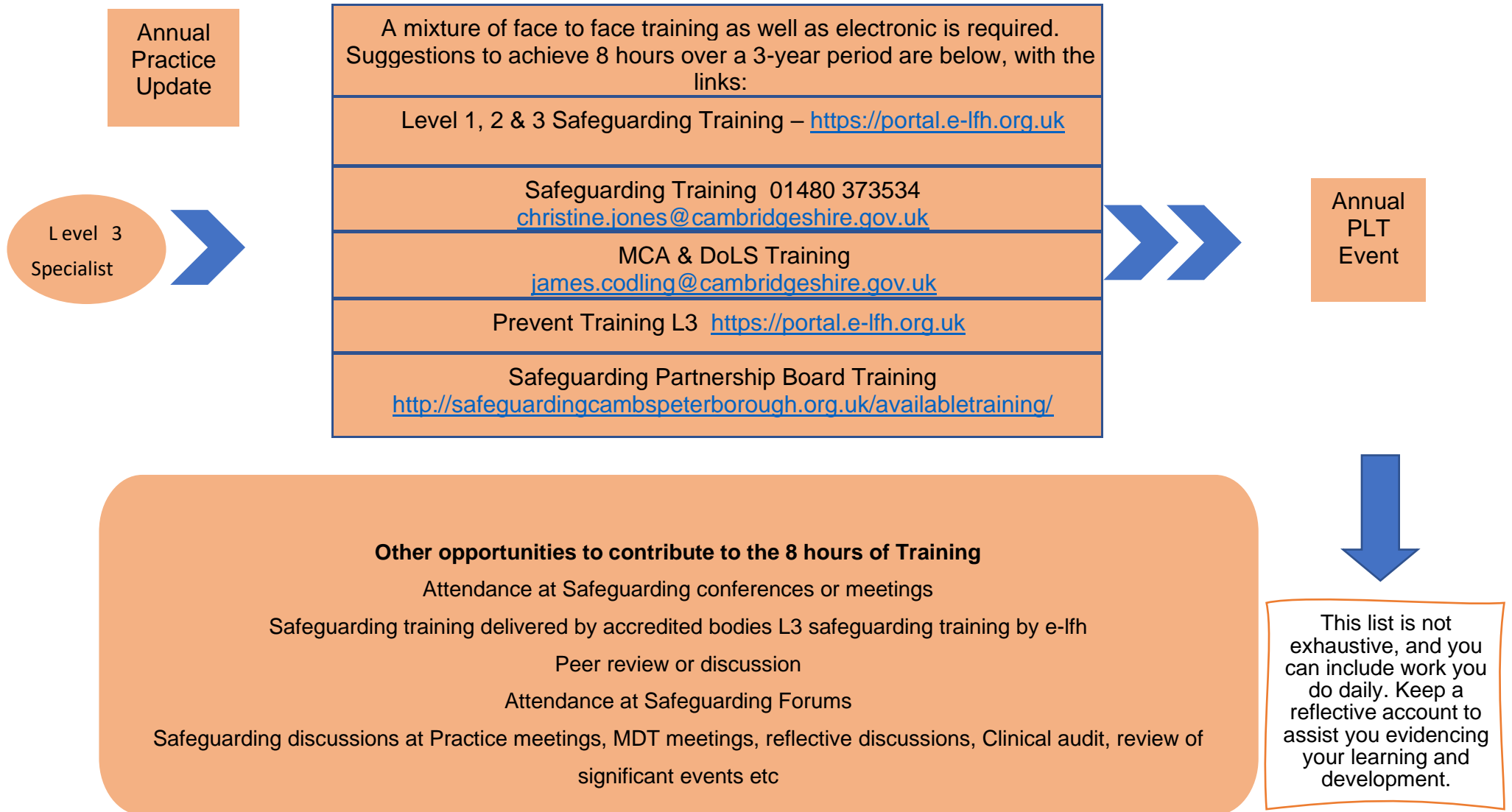

## Cambridgeshire & Peterborough CCG Level 3 Adult Safeguarding Training Links and Suggestions

- There is now a L3 Safeguarding Adults training product available via e-lfh.
- A national 'Roles and Competencies', intercollegiate document for safeguarding adults was published Summer 2018. All clinical staff require a minimum Level 3, and a total of 8 hours Safeguarding training over three years.
- To improve readability, we have produced an excel spreadsheet which summarises the core competencies, knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values, learning outcomes and training requirements for each level and are available upon request. Or refer to the RCGP website for their version.

- Prevent L3 training - the relevant modules are available on <https://portal.e-lfh.org.uk> Safeguarding Level 1, 2 & 3 – the relevant modules are on e-lfh as above
- Achieving the requisite hours must include some face to face training.
- The hours stipulated are not as onerous as would first appear, MCA & DoLs training face to face minimum 2 hours, Prevent and Safeguarding L1, 2 & 3 - e-Lfh maximum 3 hours, any other Safeguarding face to face sessions, be that case conference or additional training minimum another 3 hours - the minimum amount of hours are achieved, however do consider the 50% face to face element..
- To assist the CCG with this a reflective document has been produced that Nurses and AHPs could use to record such discussions and assist with their revalidation - this might be a useful document to aid all Practitioners with their recording.  
The CCG are also considering producing a training Passport for their staff as another quick reference guide. If this is of interest, please ask for a copy of our latest draft version.
